JUROR INFORMATION

Born in Trujillo Colon, Honduras, Wilfredo began his career as an artist and educator. It was due to his challenging of perceptions as a teacher during a time of conflict in his country that it became necessary for him to seek political asylum in the US. He arrived in the early nineties where he continued his journey as an artist by attending Montgomery College, then Maryland Institute College of Art and graduating with a BFA in sculpture. He received an MFA in sculpture at the University of Maryland. His chosen path would lead him to make contributions in the academic and artistic arenas. He has been part of numerous group shows, solo exhibits, workshops and environmental installations. In 1997, Wilfredo had his first international sculpture show in Milan, Italy where he had the opportunity to collaborate with a diverse community of artists and curators. His work is designed to cross boundaries and to move beyond the traditional paradigm of cross-cultural art. In August of 2009, he installed a piece entitled "Petalos Reflejantes," a permanent installation commissioned by Montgomery County and Auras Design. The sculpture was installed in downtown Silver Spring, MD. A recent installation and one of his most notable commissions, "Journey : Anacostia," — located in the historic neighborhood of Anacostia in Washington, DC — explores the interconnectedness of cultures. TERMS OF ENTRY

- Entry is open to artists who are either MFA Members or Anne Arundel County Residents.
- Entering this exhibition indicates understanding and agreement on the part of the artist with the conditions stated here and at mdfedart.com/mfa-general-guidelines. Work must meet delivery and exhibition guidelines to be included in the event. MFA may determine work ineligible if entry guidelines are not followed. Work delivered must correspond with the images submitted to the juror.
- Images of accepted works may be used at the sole discretion of MFA for promotional purposes including, but not limited to: the invitation, catalog, website, social media, or a subsequent year's prospectus. Images will include attribution wherever possible.
- Work cannot be withdrawn before the end of the event.
- Artists will retain 70% from sales (75% for MFA Members). MFA will retain 30% commission (25% for MFA Members) on any work sold through MFA.
- Work must be for sale. Work can be set to Price on Request (POR).

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- All work must be entered by uploading JPEG images through MFA's online entry system. Set pixel dimension to around 3,000 pixels on the longest side. File size may be no more than 5 MB. Images for the juror must correspond with the actual work. Visit mdfedart.org/portfolio/239 to submit your work.
- All entries must be original and completed solely by the artist's hand. A maximum of 6 original works created within the past 3 years may be entered. Work previously exhibited at Lowe House Office Building is not eligible for re-entry.
- Maximum size of work, including edges of artwork or frame, cannot exceed 30" in height or 24" in width).

ENTRY FEE

- 1 or 2 entries \$40 (MFA Members \$25). Additional 4 entries \$5 each. Entry fees are non-refundable.

LIABILITY

- Artwork will be handled with all possible care. MFA will not be responsible or liable for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever. Insurance, if desired, must be carried by the artist.

NOTIFICATION

- All artists will receive notification by email. Accepted artists and artwork will also be posted on MFA's website.
- The notice to accepted artists will include specific details and may vary from prospectus. See website for more details.

AWARD

- Cash awards total \$500.
